1. Entries will be accepted from Ballard County residents or members of a Ballard County organization connected with this type of exhibit.
2. Each entry must have name and address attached on the back and must be the work of exhibitor.
3. No individual may have more than one entry in each class but may exhibit in all classes.
4. Entries must have been produced by the exhibitor after the 2015 Ballard County Fair.

5. Only completed items will be accepted.
6. No pre-packaged mixes may be used in food classes.
7. All fruits and vegetables must be clean and displayed on paper or foil plate provided by exhibitor.
8. Entries will be taken at the American Legion Hall between **9 AM and 12 Noon, Wednesday, July 20th**.
9. Exhibits must be picked up between **9 AM and 11 AM, Saturday, July 23rd**. Any exhibit removed before **9 AM on July 23rd** will not be eligible for premium money. Premiums will also be forfeited if entries are not picked up by designated time.
10. The decisions of the judges will be final.
11. All exhibitors will receive awards and cash.
12. Care will be taken to guard and protect the exhibits, but the Fair Board or County Extension Homemaker Association is not liable.
13. The Fair Board or Ballard County Extension Homemaker Organization is not responsible for items not picked up by **11 AM, Saturday, July 23rd**.
